# WEEKLONG TO GRINDELWALD, SWITZERLAND

This year, 46 RA Ski club members enjoyed a wonderful week of skiing and fun in the Swiss Alps at Grindelwald Switzerland. With an all-inclusive pass good for six days of skiing and train travel to anywhere in the Jungfrau Region, there was lots of opportunity to fill our days with downhill skiing, cross country skiing, snowshoeing, and sightseeing.

We had three injuries during the week which wasn't so great for those injured, but out of 46 people skiing for a possible six days, you'd have to say we had a pretty safe trip. Testing that record were a few brave souls who took time out to ride the 800 metre Zip Line at close to 85 km/h down the mountain. All survived. Although we had a few flatlight days, the skiing was excellent as only mountain skiing can be.

Après-ski walks through the mountain village for shopping and gawking allowed us to savor the European experience in a personal way. Being there is so much better than merely wishing you were, a fact acknowledged and appreciated by those with us who were on their first European trip.

Our departure from Grindelwald during a fluffy snow storm was very picturesque. Not much later we drove down into a valley and the snow disappeared with the countryside looking very spring like. Then we started climbing up over another ridge and the snow became thick and the road slippery. So much so that our driver had to stop the bus and put on chains. Up and over the pass we went and back down again and off came the chains. In a two and a half hour period we travelled through Winter, Spring, Winter, and Spring, and we hadn't aged a bit. Indeed, though tired, after six days of healthy exercise we were probably in better shape at that point than we had been at the beginning of the trip.

Both of our flights were good, although long. An added bonus flying SWISS AIR was that we didn't have to pay extra for any of our luggage, a fact almost unheard of in today's travel industry.
